## Summer Position: Interpretive Guide-Museum

### Key Responsibilities:

#### Science Communication, Education, & Outreach

- Gallery Tours
- Outreach Events
- Social Media Engagement

#### Curation

- Collect fossil specimens under direction of Heritage Research Permit holder
- Prepare specimens with training and direction from Lab Manager
- Database and digitize (photograph) specimens



**To be considered for a position you must be eligible for the Canada Summer Jobs, Young Canada Works, or Nova Scotia Provincial SKILLS program :**

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of employment
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act and be legally entitled to work in Canada
- The successful candidate will work full-time (35 hrs/week) including weekends for the duration of the summer program, and receive **\$17-19 /hour** as compensation. Position is 8-14 weeks in duration (May-August), dependent on availability and funding.
- Ideal candidates are **students or graduates** with strong interests in the fields of biology, geology, environmental science, museum studies, education, or a related discipline. A valid driver's license and proficiency in both English and French are considered assets.
