## **POSITION SUMMARY:**

Working under the supervision of the Fossil Lab Manager, the Fossil Lab Technician and Interpreter of Collections, will work collaboratively with the Coordinator of Public Programs and other staff to effectively create and deliver information that relates to Canada's Oldest Dinosaurs and other local geology. This will include preparing fossils and sharing the information collected with our visitors in unique ways that are interactive and directed at the visitors. The role will include beach tours, museum tours, on-site activities with groups varying in age, demographic and education level.

The Fossil Lab Technician and Interpreter of Collections, will work with the lab team to gather information regarding the fossils and minerals housed on site. They will also have daily interactions with visitors to the Museum, facilitating learning. Regular tours to the dinosaur site and other sites of geological importance will be required as well.

Other tasks will include use of computer skills and software, assembly of data and other information, inventory of museum collection, and engagement with some online media. In all work, the Fossil Lab Assistant, Interpreter of Collection, will ensure all safety measures are in place and followed.

- Must be able to complete physically demanding work, including;
  - Sitting and standing for long periods
  - Able to lift 25 pounds
- Excellent hand eye coordination and microscope experience as asset.
- Careful attention to detail and very high quality results while working with museum collections and delicate fossil material.
